

Visa and Enrollment Procedure for Foreign Nationals

Once you have been accepted into the program at The Los Angeles Film School, you will need to acquire an appropriate student visa to study in the USA at The Los Angeles Film School as a foreign national. The appropriate student visa for The Los Angeles Film School is an F1 visa, unless you are the recipient of a Fullbright scholarship, in which case a J1 visa would be the appropriate visa. However, if you are the recipient of a Fullbright scholarship, Fullbright will take care of your visa needs with you and I suggest you review the matter with your contact at Fullbright.

To acquire the F1 student visa, you will need a letter of acceptance from The Los Angeles Film School, which will be sent to you upon your acceptance into the program. In addition, you will need an I-20, which is a US Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services ("BCIS") form which states that:

- 1) you have been accepted to The Los Angeles Film School;
- 2) you meet all requirements for acceptance to The Los Angeles Film School;
- 3) you have a sufficient command of the English language to benefit from the program (all our programs are taught in the English language); and
- 4) you are in possession of sufficient funds to cover all your expenses while studying in the USA or that sufficient funds will be made available to you by a sponsor (family member or other individual or entity) to cover all your expenses while in the USA.

Prior to issuance of an I-20 by The Los Angeles Film School, you must submit to The Los Angeles Film School:

- 1) a completed International Student Information Form for the program into which you have been accepted; and
- 2) documentary evidence of your financial ability to meet your expenses while studying.

A certain amount of documentation will be required to evidence your financial ability to meet all your expenses and can be in the form of bank statements showing sufficient funds available to you (or your sponsor) or letters from financial institutions stating that sufficient funds are available to you (or your sponsor). If a sponsor is involved who is a USA citizen or legal resident, an affidavit from your sponsor testifying that he/she/they will be responsible for covering your expenses will be necessary (BCIS form I-134) which will need to be completed by your sponsor and signed under oath by your sponsor. In addition, you may want to collect letters of recommendation from local authorities and scholars attesting to your commitment to pursue a course of study in the USA and your commitment to return home upon completion of your studies. Please know that school policy prohibits any of our students domestic or international from accepting employment during the school year due to the nature of the program and to do so would jeopardize your status within the school.

Once you are in possession of the I-20 document, the I-134 document completed and signed by your sponsor (if needed), evidence of financial ability to meet your expenses in the USA and any letters of recommendation, contact the local USA Consulate or Embassy servicing your geographical area and make an appointment to apply for an F1 student visa. F1 student visas are only issued by the US Department of State and may be applied for at the US Consulate or Embassy servicing your geographical area.

If you are approved and receive an F1 visa, you may then enter the USA to pursue a course of study in the USA. Generally speaking, US Customs will allow a student to enter the USA 30 days prior to the start of an educational program for the purpose of establishing housing and acclimating, however, please let the US Customs official at your port of entry know that you are entering the USA prior to the start of your educational program for this purpose so that the US Customs official will not note a departure date on your I-94 that is sooner than the end of the program.
